

Rushforth Solar Hot Water System Dedication for Family Laundry in West Chester with State Rep Bryan Lentz running for US Congress

The sun was cooking, and so were the Solar Hot Water panels for the enthusiastic crowd in West Chester! Friday, June 18, 2010 was a Celebration of another local business going for Solar Hot Water: Family Laundry at West Goshen Town Centre, 1107 West Chester Pike, in West Chester.

Rushforth Solar LLC of Bryn Mawr designed and installed the eight 4x10 panel system with a 450 gallon tank. Skyline Innovations out of DC paid for the system. County Commissioner Kathi Cozzone expressed her praises for all involved. When you wash your whites at Family Laundry, the sun heats the hot water.

Front and center was decorated Iraq War Veteran and former Prosecutor **State Rep Bryan Lentz, candidate for US Congress**, who acknowledged the investment and the trickle down impact of many offshoot businesses getting benefit when one business goes solar. Lentz noted that solar jobs aren't outsourced to other countries and actually help our US national security.

Timing was imminent for passage of PA legislation HB 2405 – the Clean Energy and Green Jobs bill that could dramatically impact the number of future solar jobs and the energy mix in PA and provide Solar Thermal with Solar Renewable Energy Credits or SRECs. Rep Lentz was a co-sponsor of HB 2405 and he is a sponsor of Keystone Green Energy Zone.
